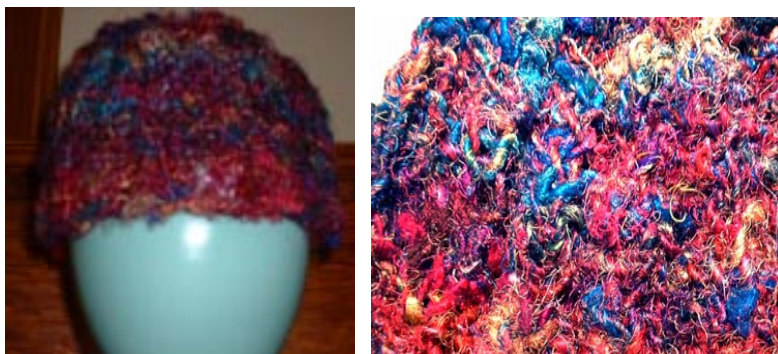


Recycled Silk Knit Chemo Cap® ThreadingWater.com



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Pattern Notes: This yarn is heavy, but if knit very loosely, makes a comfortable, soft and warm cap that can be worn next to the skin. The key is to knit it loose enough so that the yarn's silk fibers can "bloom."

Yarn: Himalaya Yarn's Recycled Silk – One skein

Size: Adult – medium

Needles: 16" circular and DPN's in US 9 – 10.5, or size necessary to obtain gauge

Gauge: Approximately 3 sts/ inch

Pattern: Mistake Rib (multiples of 4 + 3)

Row 1: (K2, P2) repeat to end, end with P1

Row 2: K1 (P2, K2) repeat to end

Directions:

Using circular needle, cast on 67 stitches and join sts, being careful not to twist.

Repeat the two rows of Mistake Rib pattern until knitting measures 5-5.5 inches from cast on edge.

Begin decreases for crown, switching to dpn's when necessary.

Decrease as follows:

Decrease round 1: Change all K2's in your pattern row to K2 tog

Decrease round 2: Change all P2's in your pattern row to P2 tog

The remainder of your decrease rows will be Knit

Decrease rounds 3, 4 and 5: K2 tog

Finishing: Cut yarn, leaving 5 inch tail. Thread through darning needle, pull tail through remaining stitches, pull closed and secure to inside of cap. Weave in any loose ends.
